MISSIONAL COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP COMMITMENT

We are the family of God, on the mission of God, making disciples of Jesus. The primary focus of your Missional Community is to live out your true identity as a family member, a missionary, and a disciple.

Personal Commitments

- Pray and listen to the Spirit consistently.
- Spend regular times in the Scriptures.
- Regularly attend Soma Sunday gatherings.
- Participate in bi-monthly leader's meetings.
- Communication with your coach every month.
- Actively develop relationships with friends who are yet to follow Jesus.

Big Picture Direction

- Once a year, lead your Missional Community in writing up a commitment (blueprint) with details about your mission and rhythms. Oversee and continually communicate the vision of your missional community through the remainder of the year.
- Attempt to identify co-leaders in your MC and prepare them for the possibility of someday leading their own.
- Share leadership roles with others over each of the identities: family, mission, and disciple.

Mission:

- Regularly lead your people in prayer for friends who are not yet followers, serving them, and sharing Jesus.
- Help your Missional Community create a plan to *together* love, serve, and share Jesus with at least one person who is not yet a follower.
- Help your Missional Community to intentionally create opportunities for all of you to get to know the people that each is introducing to Jesus, thus growing and incorporating them into the MC life.
- Within 6 weeks create a regular third space opportunity. (Once a month recommended).

Family:

- Foster regular and ongoing interaction among the people in your Missional Community (not including your weekly dinner) so that you live increasingly like a family on mission.
- Pray regularly for each individual in your Missional Community.
- Develop others as hosts of family dinners in their own homes.

Disciples:

 Help connect all your MC members into a DNA group of the same gender. Quarterly check in on these small group disciple meetings. Encourage them to grow in transparency, in confession, and in sharing struggles.
